1 Seodaemun Independence Park



It is a historical park where you can honor the patriotic martyrs who endured hardships during the Japanese Occupation. The Seodaemun Prison History Hall is also located in the park.



🚇 Take the subway to Dongnimmun Station (Line 3) and walk for 1 minute from the elevator at Exit No. 4.

2 Gyeonghuigung Palace



It was constructed in the 9th year in King Gwanghaegun's reign (1617) and state affairs were handled in this palace. With 100 or buildings, it was one of three largest palaces of the Joseon Dynasty. However, only a part of it survived the vandalism of Japanese colonists.



🚇 Take the subway to Gwanghwamun Station (Line 5) and walk for 15 minutes from the elevator at Exit No. 1.

3 Seoul Museum of History



This urban history museum helps visitors understand the history and culture of Seoul from prehistoric to modern times.

4 Cheongwadae Sarangchae



It shows the traces of the former presidents of the Republic of Korea and Korean traditional culture. The 'Korea Tourism Exhibit Hall' introduces tourist attractions and festivals in Korea.

5 Gyeongbokgung Palace



It was constructed in the 4th year in the reign of King Taejo (1395). As the first palace ever constructed in the Joseon Dynasty, it boasts the unparalleled scale and architectural beauty among the five palaces of Joseon. Today, it is the landmark of Seoul.



🚇 Take the subway to Gyeongbokgung Station (Line 3) and walk for 5 minutes from the elevator at Exit No. 4.

6 The National Folk Museum of Korea







7 National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art Seoul



With the concept of 'wide garden,' this museum offers various contents, including performance and education, focused on modern and contemporary art.

8 Changdeokgung Palace



It is a nature-friendly palace of the Joseon Dynasty, constructed after Gyeongbokgung Palace in the 5th year in King Taejong's reign (1405). The rear garden of Changdeokgung Palace is the representative royal family garden and was registered as the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage in 1997.



- Take a low floor bus at Exit No. 6, Anguk Station (Line 3) (2 minutes) and walk for 4 minutes from the bus stop. (Bus #151, 170-2, 109, 162, 272)

9 Jongmyo Shrine



This is the ancestral shrine enshrining the tablets of the royal family of Joseon. It was burned down during the Japanese Invasion of Korea in 1592 and reconstructed afterward. It was registered as UNESCO World Cultural Heritage in 1995 to recognize the value of the ancestral rites held for over six centuries.



- Take the subway to Jongno3(sam)-ga Station (Line1 & 5) and walk for 3 minutes from the elevator between exit No.12 and 13.

10 Changgyeonggung Palace



Constructed in 1483, in the reign of King Seongjong of the Joseon Dynasty, it was referred to as Donggwol (East Palaces) alongside Changdeokgung Palace. It is also the scene of court tragedies such as the execution of Royal Consort, Lang Hui-bin, the death of Crown Prince Sado, and demolition of the palace into a zoo by Japanese colonists.



- Take a low floor bus at Exit No. 6, Anguk Station (Line 3) (7 minutes) and walk for 1 minute from the bus stop. (Bus #151, 172, 272, 171)

11 National Children's Science Center




Established to cultivate creative talent to lead the future, this is the first national science museum in Korea.

13 Seoul Metropolitan Library



Located in Jung-gu, Seoul, this public library was built by renovating the former Seoul City Hall and was opened in 2012.

14 Deoksugung Palace



Used as a residence for King Gojong, the palace was a historical site of the late period of Joseon. Featuring traditional wooden architecture and Western-style architecture, it has a different look from other palaces built during the Joseon Dynasty.


18 Culture Station Seoul 284

22 Namsan Cable Car



Namsan cable car is an aerial tramway in Seoul. Built in 1962, it spans from the Hoehyeon-dong platform to the Yejang-dong platform near the top of Mt. Namsan and the N Seoul Tower. It is the first commercial cable car service for passengers in Korea. The length of the cable is 605 metres.




28 Yongsan Park

This city park was established in 1992 by recreating a site that used to be a golf course for the US Armed Forces in Korea after Korea gained independence.


